Are you thinking about running as a candidate for the Historic Cultural North Neighborhood Council?

Support HCNNC volunteers are hosting a Candidate Information Session. All HCNNC stakeholders are invited to attend. Come learn more about running as a candidate, and serving on your neighborhood council's board. We will answer questions and help with registration.

Note: Attendance at this session is optional, and is not required for candidates.

About HCNNC

The Historic Cultural North Neighborhood Council is Los Angeles's newest neighborhood council, representing El Pueblo, Solano Canyon, Victor Heights, and Chinatown, including the area around William Mead Homes and Ann Street Elementary School.

What are neighborhood councils?

Neighborhood Councils are City-certified local groups made up of people who live, work, own property or have some other connection to a neighborhood. Neighborhood Council Board Members are elected or selected to their positions by the people in the respective neighborhoods themselves.

Who can run to represent their neighborhood?

If you are 15 years old or older, and you are a stakeholder — you live, work, rent or own property, own a business, attend school, worship, volunteer, or participate in an organization that meets in and/or serves that neighborhood — you are eligible to serve on the board.

Which board seats will be on the ballot on April 4th?

The governing board of HCNNC consists of seventeen (17) representatives: five (5) from Chinatown, three (3) from El Pueblo, three (3) from Solano Canyon, three (3) from Victor Heights, and three (3) at-large representatives from any of the four neighborhoods. The boundaries of the neighborhoods are defined in HCNNC's bylaws, as shown in our maps.

All 17 board seats will be on the ballot on April 4th. Community members are encouraged to apply and run. The deadline to register as a candidate is Tuesday, January 22, 2019.
