Everywhere Beer proposes to reopen the Fred Harvey Room at Union Station and continue the approved use as a restaurant and brewery comprised of 11,446 square feet of floor area, 22,175 square feet of total alcohol license area and 376 patron seats within the ground floor, mezzanine, and basement including 11,925 square feet of Type 47 general license area for on-site consumption of a full line of alcohol and 10,250 square feet of Type 23 small beer manufacturer license area for the production and sale of beer for off-site consumption and consumption in the Type 47 general alcohol license area.
